Putting Neighborhoods First



The City's network of neighborhoods sets us apart from any other community. Neighborhood leadership, neighborhood safety, neighborhood beautification – if it has to do with neighborhoods, the City of Tallahassee is engaged. Through its Neighborhood

Affairs division in collaboration with other departments, the City provides a variety of programs that strengthen local neighborhoods and empower residents. Leading up to hurricane season, the City offers workshops for its popular Neighborhood PREP (Plan for Readiness and Emergency Preparedness) program. During this year's virtual presentations, participants will learn what supplies to have on hand, steps to protect their home and resources available that can help them and their neighbors organize before and after a storm. Each fall, a cohort of residents gets a first-hand look at the breadth and depth of City services through its Neighborhood Leadership Academy. Applications for this multi-week program typically open in August.

Every neighborhood has unique needs and goals. To support resident-led initiatives, the City offers support for neighborhood planning through the Neighborhood First process and special projects through the Vibrant Neighborhood Grants program.

To help neighborhoods access these offerings and more, each neighborhood within the City of Tallahassee's boundaries has a Neighborhood Services Coordinator (NSC) assigned



to it. It is the role of NSCs to serve as liaisons between neighborhoods and the City, helping residents effectively access City services and get issues resolved. Not sure who your NSC is? Stay Safe While Swimming

If you find yourself daydreaming about the return of warm temperatures and getting back to swimming, this is the perfect time to make sure everyone in your house is prepared for the fun! Use these tips from the Tallahassee Fire Department to help you stay safe around water:

- Install barriers around your home pool or hot tub.
- Safety tools, like a pool hook or rescue tube, should be kept nearby.
- Actively supervise children whenever they are in or near the water.
- Install proper lighting around the pool. Motion sensors can help make sure a light is always on when needed.

For those who want to learn or brush up their swimming skills, the City's Parks, Recreation & Neighborhood Affairs department offers swim lessons for ages 6 months to adults (13 & older). Check **Talgov.com/Aquatics** this spring to register.

Additionally, the City is looking for great lifeguards. In partnership with the American Red Cross, the Aquatics Division offers lifeguard training classes for those interested in protecting the safety of swimmers. For details, visit **Talgov.com/Aquatics** or call 850-891-4903.
